

2014 CESifo Area Conference on Energy and Climate Economics



Call for Papers

On 17–18 October 2014, CESifo will organise the CESifo Area Conference on Energy and Climate Economics in Munich. The purpose of the conference is to bring together the members of the CESifo Research Network to present and discuss their ongoing research, and to stimulate interaction and co-operation between them. All CESifo research network members are invited to submit their papers, which may deal with any topic in the field of Energy and Climate Economics.

The keynote speaker will be **Till Requate**, University of Kiel.

The deadline for the submission of complete papers, or 2-3 page abstracts, is **13 July 2014**. Preference will be given to complete papers. Papers for the conference should be submitted under the following link: www.cesifo-group.de/ece14/w/3MH6VEXh5

Authors of submitted papers will be notified no later than **17 August**, **2014** as to whether their paper has been accepted for the workshop. Papers which are more related to the topic of other area conferences will be re-directed to the respective area coordinator. Please note that the **same paper** is allowed to be submitted to **only one** of the CESifo area conferences.

CESifo will provide accommodation, and reimburse economy travel costs for CESifo Research Fellows/Affiliates with accepted papers. All papers presented at the conference will appear in the CESifo Working Paper Series. Other network members are invited to attend, but are expected to provide their own funding for travel and accommodation.

Distinguished CESifo Affiliate - Call for Nominations

In an effort to encourage talented young scholars, CESifo has instituted the *Distinguished CESifo Affiliate* prize, to be awarded to the best paper presented by a young author at the CESifo Area Conference on Energy and Climate Economics. Candidates will be accepted from close to completion of their PhD, to no more than five years after having completed it. The same limit applies to co-authors in the case of papers with multiple authors. The criteria for the award are scientific originality, policy relevance and quality of exposition. The winning paper will appear in the CESifo Working Paper Series and the prize winner will receive €3000.

All CESifo Research Fellows are welcome to nominate candidates for the award (please note that it is not mandatory for candidates to be from the research network). To nominate a candidate, a CESifo Research Fellow must submit the nominee's paper to Michael Hoel, University of Oslo (michael@econ.uio.no), along with a brief letter explaining the motivation for the nomination. **The deadline for nominations is 13 July 2014.**
