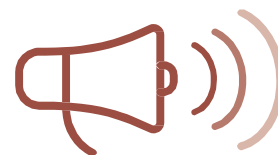

CESifo invites submissions to the 2024 CESifo Area Conference on Economics of Digitization. The purpose of the conference is to bring together researchers from a broad range of economic disciplines to present and discuss ongoing research leveraging data sets made possible through the digitization of economic activity. The conference will have a focus on work at the intersection of digitization with public policy. Submissions may deal with any topic in digitization and public policy, including applied methodological work.

Please note that the same paper can only be submitted to one of the CESifo Area Conferences. Papers which are more related to the topic of other Area Conferences may be re-directed to the respective Area Director.

All papers presented at the conference will appear in the CESifo Working Paper Series.

Nominations for DISTINGUISHED CESIFO AFFILIATE AWARD

All CESifo Research Fellows are invited to submit nominations for the Distinguished CESifo Affiliate Award, given to the candidate presenting the best paper at the conference. Nominees for this award, aimed at encouraging talented young scholars, must be no more than five years after having completed their Ph.D. (The same limit applies to co-authors in the case of papers with multiple authors). It is not mandatory for candidates to be from the CESifo research network. The criteria for the award are scientific originality, policy relevance, and quality of exposition. The winning paper will appear in the CESifo Working Paper Series, and the prize winner will receive a €2,000 prize.

To nominate a candidate, a CESifo Research Fellow must submit the nominee's paper to Stephen P. Ryan (stephen.p.ryan@wustl.edu) along with a brief letter explaining the motivation for the nomination. The deadline for nominations is **1 August 2024**.
